National Skin Cancer Action Week 17th– 23rd November



Cancer Council Australia recommends people see their doctor if they notice a new spot or changes in size, shape or colour of an existing spot, for clinical skin examinations for the early detection of melanoma



- Melanomas become harder to treat the longer they are left. This is why early detection is important.
- Patients can find their own melanomas, but Doctors tend to find less obvious ones.
- People should check their skin regularly and see a Doctor for any changes.
- In the St Agnes Skin Cancer Clinic, our Doctor uses a high definition Molemax machine for early skin cancer detection.
- Self-diagnosing skin cancer with smartphone apps is not recommended.

National Cervical Cancer Awareness Week 17th– 23rd November

This year, the theme is 'The Power of Choice' Protecting yourself and preventing cervical cancer has never been easier.

1. The HPV vaccine is free for all young people (male and female) up to age 26. Speak to your GP if you missed vaccination at school
2. A cervical screening test is recommended every 5 years for women and those with a cervix from age 25–74 years.
3. Choose your screening method:
 - a. Have a health professional perform a cervical screening test
 - b. Self-collection is now also possible if you meet eligibility criteria. Speak to your GP for more information
